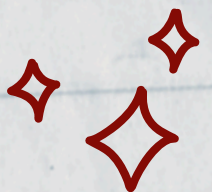

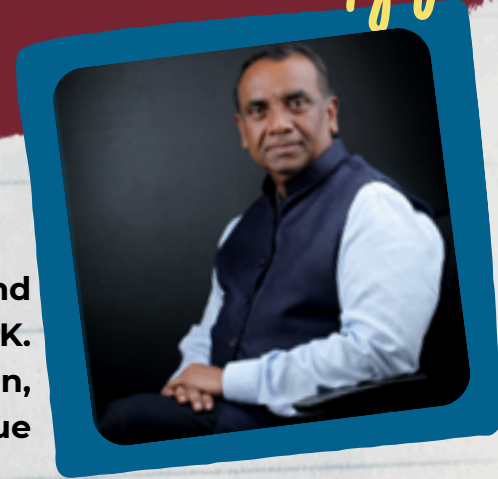

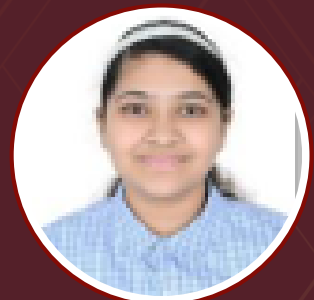

ENDURING THE INFERNO

Navigating the Fiery Future: Heatwave Preparedness in the Gulf Region

Driving through the palm-studded boulevards while basking in the sun's warm rays is truly a tropical experience. However, that same enjoyable heat has started to become more dangerous for the inhabitants living in the Gulf region as, thanks to climate change, heatwaves and other crises have started to increase in both terms of duration and frequency. Due to a significant increase in temperature, the infrastructure of the area and the general lifestyle of the citizens is at risk. Because of this, better strategies and plans have to be in place for dealing with the heated temperatures in the future.

In extreme situations, being ready to put together a plan which involves taking individual measures would become necessary. In order to keep the body temperature low, keeping yourself hydrated, remaining in one's cool beverage and eating water-heavy foods such as watermelons would be a good course of action. Furthermore, wearing light loose clothing drastically improves air circulation while also preventing our bodies from retaining too much heat. Another useful method would be trimming strenuous activities to not be carried out between mid-day and late afternoon as during those periods, the heat is at its highest. Raising awareness regarding heat stroke symptoms such as nausea, dizziness, and excessive sweating would also help aid people who are undergoing the symptoms by providing them early intervention.

People suffering from heat waves would be greatly supported by the different community action plans and schemes while also having a sustainable strategy easily available to them. Telling and warning residents of the area in advance through media, community leaders and mosques regarding methods they could employ to keep themselves fresh would also be beneficial to these people. Another important method would be establishing cooling centers, enabling people in need of a cold place to relax without paying any costs, during the blistering heat. Additionally, teaching vulnerable populations such as the elderly would greatly help them in sharing the information.

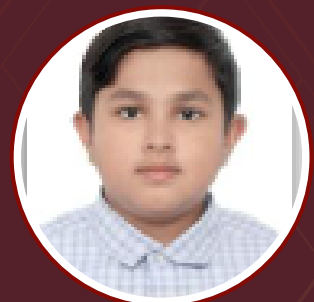

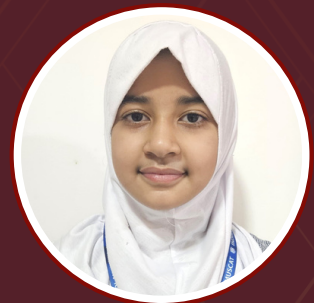
Turning Exam Stress into Success: A Confident Path Forward
